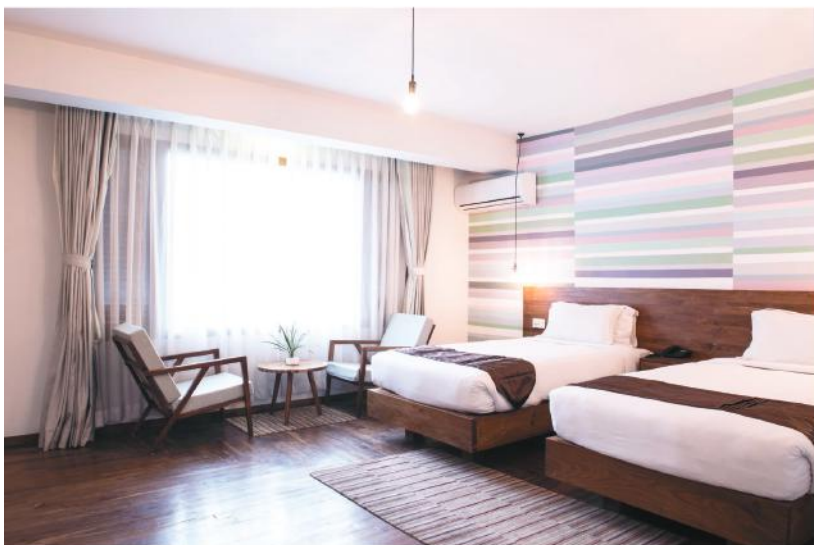

Note from the Director

The kimff team is excited to present a lineup of films that encompass diverse narratives about people, places, culture and mountain sport. Our films cover a wide range of genres from fiction to non-fiction, and styles from cinema verite, adventure cinema, experimental shorts, and light-hearted POV films.



In this hybrid edition of kimff, we hope audiences are inspired by adventurers and individuals who have lived life on their own terms in *Overland*, *Climbing Iran*, and *Dream Mountain*. We are moved by the films *Ek tha gaon*, *Last Days at Sea* and *When Glaciers Go* where the protagonists struggle with the impacts of climate change on their homes and lives, and, we empathise with the dilemmas of the characters in *The Riyalists*, *Cows on the Roof*, and *The Wall of Shadows*.

The 13 films in Nepal Panorama spotlight local talent and stories about contemporary Nepal. The female protagonists in *Julungo*, *Lahureni*, and *Yet Another Winter* make us smile and want to cry at their predicaments; we are inspired by a filmmaking duo's creative tribute to Kurosawa in *The Big-Headed Boy*, *Shamans & Samurais*, and are moved by the sensitive coming out film of a journalist in *I wanted to be Like Madhuri Dixit*. We laugh out loud at the irreverent antics of Maoist cadres in *The Red Grave*.

Festival highlights include a Keynote Address by environmentalist and Rolex Laureate Sonam Wangchuk from Ladakh, India; a Master Class and exhibition of mountain photography by US based photographer Cira Crowell; a short film contest Green Growth- Green Recovery; a Tik Tok Challenge for Climate Justice; film screenings and a panel on *Breaking Code Red - Dignity Without Danger*, around menstrual practices in Nepal; and the book release of *Mero Khojyatra*, the Nepali edition of Swiss geologist Toni Hagen's *Building Bridges to the Third World*.

The festival team invites you to the in-person and virtual Q & As, the critical and creative conversations with participating filmmakers and speakers, and, to meet our jury online.

We hope our festival tagline this year 'Climate Karma' will prompt audiences to think about how we engage with the environment and what we can do to reduce the impacts of climate change being felt worldwide.

Jury

Anup Baral is a renowned theatre director, actor, and conceptual artist. He has a Master's degree in Acting from India's National School of Drama. Baral has directed and conceptualized more than three dozen plays as well as acted in numerous productions in his two decade-long career. He is known as a visual poet and experimental director who brings multi-disciplinary approaches to theatre and through live performance, visual art, and digital media. Baral's theatre pieces, performances, and installations explore such themes as urban conflict, body politics, migration, and marginalization. He was awarded the Rashtriya Pratibha Puraskar in 1999 and the Balkrishna Sama Award in 2013 for his contribution to Nepali Theatre. He won the national Best Actor award for *Dashdhunga*.



Caroline Fink is a filmmaker, photographer, and writer based in Switzerland. A passionate alpinist, her work focuses on the Alps, the mountains of the world, and people connected to the mountains. Discovering for herself, being fully immersed, and looking at the world with the eyes of a child are the most important tools of Fink's work. She firmly believes that what moves oneself has the power to inspire others. Fink specializes in direction and camerawork. As a photographer she works in the genres of classic reportage and alpine photography, and has a close cooperation with Leica Switzerland. A recent project led her to Nepal, where she worked as a cameraperson for an all-female expedition to Dhaulagiri. www.caroline-fink.ch



Mario Casella's life is divided between his two passions: writing and the mountains. He studied literature, and trained as a mountain guide. In 1985, he began working as a full time journalist, first for radio and then for television with Swiss Radio and Television, RSI. Casella's documentaries have covered the fall of the Berlin Wall, the former East Germany and other Eastern Bloc countries, Russia, Chernobyl, Croatia, Bosnia, Serbia, Kosovo, Chechnya, Afghanistan, and China. Casella headed the foreign newsroom of RSI before moving to Washington as a correspondent for CSR. He left full time journalism in 2007 to devote himself more to the mountains, independent documentaries, and writing, but continues to collaborate with RSI to produce documentaries and long reportage.



kimff 2021 Keynote Speaker

Sonam Wangchuk is an environmentalist and a Rolex Award Laureate. He was born in the trans-Himalayan region of Ladakh in J&K, India.

Though a Mechanical Engineer by education, he has been mostly working in the field of education reform for more than 27 years. In 1988, just after he finished his engineering studies he founded SECMOL (Students' Educational and Cultural Movement of Ladakh) www.secmol.org, which aims to bring reforms in the government school system in Ladakh. In 1994 he was instrumental in the launch of Operation New Hope, a triangular collaboration of the government, village communities and the civil society to bring reforms in the government schools system. The programme involved formation of Village Education Committees to take ownership of state schools, training of teachers in child friendly ways and re-writing and publishing localised text books for Ladakh. As a result, the pass percentage at 10th grade (matriculation) rose from the dismal 5% to 55% in seven years and 75% these days.



For students who still failed in their state exams he founded the SECMOL Alternative School Campus near Leh, a special school where the admission criteria is failure in exams and not grades. However, with the supportive and creative environment at the school, the so called failures have excelled in their chosen fields and risen to international acclaim as entrepreneurs, filmmakers, politicians, and teachers.

As an engineer Sonam Wangchuk has been teaching innovation at the SECMOL Alternative School, where together with the students he designed and built solar heated buildings that are low cost, made of earth/mud but maintain +15 C even when the outside temperature is – 15 C in Ladakhi winters.

In order to solve the water crisis facing mountain regions due to climate change and fast melting glaciers he invented the Ice Stupa artificial glacier which stores the wasting stream waters in winter in the form of giant ice cones or stupas and releases the water in late spring as they melt... just when farmers need water.

He has received numerous awards, including the prestigious Ramon Magsaysay Award 2018, The GQ Men Of The Year Award for Social Entrepreneur of the Year 2017 in India, The Rolex Award for Enterprise 2016 in Hollywood USA, The Terra Award 2016 for World's best Earth Buildings in Lyon France, The UNESCO Chair for Earth Architecture for India in 2014, 'Real Heroes' Award by CNN IBN Channel in 2008, 'Green Teacher' Award by Sanctuary Asia Magazine in 2005, Ashoka Fellowship by Ashoka: Innovators for the Public in 2002, 'Man of the Year' by The Week magazine in India in 2001 and the Governors Medal by the J&K State Government in 1996.

Filmmakers from western Nepal will join a panel of filmmakers and activists under the theme of 'Breaking Code Red' to discuss their films and their impact to help break the

silence that surrounds the topic of menstruation. By reflecting on the key messages of the films we can work together to develop innovative strategies to address menstrual exclusion in Nepal. Nearly all women and girls throughout the country practice at least one menstrual restriction, which prevent women and girls from fully participating in economic and social life, negatively affecting school attendance and employment.

Dignity Without Danger (DWD) is a three-year research study funded by the British Academy that has explored the various and complex stigma and taboos associated with menstruation. The DWD research project was launched in 2018 at kimff with the first panel on 'Breaking Code Red' which showcased films made by the daughters and young girls from the same village that the two new films *Stay Away* and *8 Days* have been made supported by Sara Baumann and Nepal Fertility Care Centre.

Both of these films are being premiered at kimff and screened with other Nepali produced films on the theme of menstruation.

The event is supported by Dignity Without Danger, British Academy, Liverpool John Moores University, Global Action Nepal, GiZ and the MHHMPA.

20,000 Meters Unter der Erde (20,000 Meters Under The Earth)

90 min | Germany | 2021

The Riesending is Germany's deepest, longest shaft cave. The rocky corridors wind downwards for almost 25km into the Untersberg Mountain, descending 1,200m through a spectacular subterranean landscape. The film joins an elite team of explorers as they journey into one of the most difficult caves in the world, seeking its end point, the only people ever to have been granted permission to do so. Specialised light-sensitive, lightweight cameras and lighting help provide a glimpse into the incredible underground world many days away from the earth's surface. These cavers are explorers in the true sense of the word. This underground journey is perhaps the greatest adventure that can be found in today's well-mapped and organized industrial world.

Filmmakers

20,000 Meters Under the Earth was written by **Petra Höfer** and **Freddie Röckenhaus**, directed by Freddie Röckenhaus and produced by colourFIELD. The award-winning duo, described as "the Lennon-McCartney of German documentary", have produced more than 80 full-length documentaries, documentary series, and docudramas related to science and education, including the 13-part series and movie, *Germany from Above*, the most successful documentary ever in Germany. Before making films, Röckenhaus was staff editor of *Die Zeit* and *Süddeutsche Zeitung*, and won the German Pulitzer equivalent, the Henri Nannen Preis in 2005. Höfer was an editor for *die tageszeitung* and *Monitor*. colourFIELD productions include the series *Beautiful Minds-Voyage Into The Brain*, licensed in more than 60 countries, *Automatic Brain*, *The Virus Empire*, *Migrating Birds-Scouts of Distant Worlds*, and *Tropic Fever*. The couple produced the documentary *Love in Power*, about Michelle and Barack Obama.

With the birth of their child they find renewed happiness and hope. The film has moments of nostalgia for a life left behind and the hope of a better future, with the beginning of a new life.

Suraj Bhattarai, 33, is from Thimphu, Bhutan. He recently earned a Master's in Documentary Film Directing from the Doc Nomads Joint-Masters programme in Lisbon, Budapest, and Belgium. Bhattarai has directed four short documentaries as part of the degree. He also holds a graduate degree in Business from Leiden University. Bhattarai has worked as a documentary producer and attended and pitched a feature project at various documentary platforms and workshops, including Docs Port Incheon (2018) and the Japan Prize in Tokyo (2018) as a finalist. He is currently working as an Assistant Director for a feature length documentary.

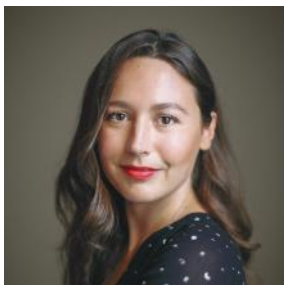
After Antarctica

105 min | USA | 2021

A journey across both poles, *After Antarctica* follows legendary polar explorer Will Steger's lifelong journey as an eyewitness to the greatest changes to the polar regions. In 1989, an international crew of six explorers and scientists led by Steger set out to be the first humans to cross Antarctica by dog-sled. Their mission: to draw attention to the rapidly changing frozen continent and convince world leaders to renew the Antarctic Treaty, in order to shield Antarctica from industrial profiteers for the next 50 years. Now, as Steger ventures out onto the ice once again, at the age of 75 and into the Arctic tundra, he recounts the historic, death-defying journey that forever changed his life and led him to where he is today. Interspersing contemporary travels with riveting vérité archival footage, *After Antarctica* is a wilderness thriller that immerses us in the danger, tension, and sacrifice Steger and his team faced at every turn in order to complete their historic mission.

Filmmaker

Tasha Van Zandt is a documentary director, cinematographer, writer, and Emmy-nominated producer who has documented stories on all seven continents. Her projects have been supported by SFFILM, Film Independent, and the Sundance Institute. Her documentary short film *Tehachapi*, co-directed with the artist JR, followed the creation of a participatory work of art in a supermax prison. Another short, *One Thousand Stories*, offered an intimate look into the creation of JR's first-of-its-kind interactive mural, exhibited at the SFMOMA. Van Zandt has been commissioned by *Time*, *The Guardian*, HBO, Netflix, VICE, and National Geographic Expeditions.





Agua Desgasta Roca (Water Wears Rock)

Water Wears Rock tells the story of Alberto Garcia, a climber who has suffered from multiple sclerosis since he was 17 years. He has found a way of life in sports, which helps him to improve as a person and keeps his disease at bay. Despite his physical limitations, his goal is to climb the Naranjo de Bulnes in Asturias, Spain. This 2,510m high peak is one of Europe's toughest climbs.

Fabiano is haunted by nightmares, a reflection of his life as the heir of his father's small-scale agricultural business in an isolated valley of southern Switzerland. He owns fifty goats and eight cows and is trying his best to produce the Alpine cheese his hippie parents first made back in the 1980s. But nothing is going the way it should. Fabiano is in debt, the hut that he rents for the summer is dilapidated, and the goat cheese business is no longer profitable. His thoughts keep returning to a fatal accident a Macedonian illegal worker met with the previous year, which he feels that he is at least in part responsible for. Fabiano is not exactly in a good place to start a family, but his girlfriend Eva is expecting, and hoping to fulfill her dreams of a simple life surrounded by nature and animals. How can they build a life together in such difficult circumstances?

Filmmaker

Aldo Gugolz was born in Lucerne in 1963 and studied political science and communication in Zürich, while working as a photojournalist for several Swiss newspapers. He then attended the Hochschule für Fernsehen und Film in München and has since worked as a filmmaker in Germany and Switzerland. Gugolz's directing credits include several documentaries for television and cinema, among which *Zeit im Fluss* (1997), *Leben Ausser Atem* (2001), *Wir Zwei* (2009) and *Rue de Blamage* (2017) were big hits in German-speaking Swiss theaters.

16 min | Brazil | 2021

As fires rage in the Amazon hundreds of miles away, a young nurse, Lucia, senses something off in the air and begins to have doubts about her pregnancy. A reluctant favor to her ailing grandmother brings Lucia to a neo-Pentecostal church, where she is drawn to a charismatic young parishioner and her faith.

Filmmaker

Jasmin Tenucci is a Brazilian filmmaker who has written, directed, or produced films in Brazil, Iceland, Pakistan, and the United States. Her most recent short film, *August Sky* (2021), was a Cannes Short Film 2021 Official Selection. Tenucci co-produced and associate directed the short film *Darling* (2019), which won Best Short Film at the 2019 Venice Film Festival. Tenucci also directed four episodes of the Brazilian television series *Shop Tudo* (Glaze Entretenimento/ Fall 2021), co-developed and wrote on the acclaimed series *As Five* (2020), and created and served as showrunner on the dramedy *Tempero Secreto* (2016). Currently, she is writing a soon-to-be-announced Netflix series that will premiere in January 2022. Jasmin has a BA in film from São Paulo University and an MFA in writing and directing from Columbia University's film school. While at Columbia, she taught directing to undergraduates and was a founder of a collective of filmmakers from around the world with whom she works till date. Jasmin is developing two feature films, one based on *August Sky*, and *The Smallest Whale in the World*, which won the 2017 Alfred P. Sloan Development Grant.



Between Fire and Water

92 min | Colombia | 2020

Camilo is the adopted son of an indigenous couple of the Quillasinga tribe from the Cocha lagoon, in the southwest of Colombia. He is the only black person in his community and has always felt different. For years, he has been wondering about his biological parents. The Quillasinga governor gives him ayahuasca, a sacred remedy for spiritual guidance. During this transcendent experience, Camilo has visions of his biological mother. Supported by his adoptive father, Camilo embarks on a journey to find his true identity.

Filmmaker

Viviana Gómez Echeverry is a Colombian director, producer, and cinematographer. She studied Social Communication at the Javeriana University in Bogota. In Spain she specialized in cinematography and received a Master's degree in Scriptwriting. She is an alumna of Chicken & Egg Pictures, Talents Buenos Aires, the Tribeca Film Institute, the Colombian Film Fund, and Bolivia Lab. Her credits include two short films, *Exotic Tropical* and *16th Birthday* (writer and director) and *Life is Sacred*, (co-director with Andreas Dalsgaard and director of photography), produced by two-time Oscar-nominated production company Final Cut for Real. Her first feature film *Keyla* was selected for the Warsaw Film Festival, the Curaçao International Film Festival Rotterdam, the Sao Paulo Latin-American Film Festival, and the Cartagena International Film Festival, among others.

Cinquanta Passi (Fifty Steps)

54 min 08 sec | Switzerland | 2019

Climate change and endangered glaciers raise new questions, above all for those like mountain guide and rescuer Michele Cucchi, known as “Lungo”, who have always lived and worked in the mountains they are passionate about. In today’s rapidly changing world, the challenge is no longer conquering new summits, but developing environmental and humanitarian projects to conserve an increasingly fragile ecosystem and help those who live in the mountains. The retreat of glaciers brings to light the traces of our passage and also the bodies of those who never returned home. Cucchi is always moved by the desire to enhance the memory and protection of these fragile environments, whether in the Karakorum, following an environmental education program with Agostino Da Polenza, or in Zermatt, with glaciologist Michele Freppaz, anthropologist Elisabetta Dall’O, Air Zermatt CEO and pilot Gerold Biner, and the “historical memory of Zermatt” , former rescuer and mountain guide Bruno Jelk.

Filmmaker

Niccolò Aiazzi was born in 1982 in Ferrara, Italy and grew up in Milan. His lifelong passion for alpinism, skiing, and the great outdoors drives his storytelling. Aiazzi focuses on the relationship between people and wilderness, travelling around the world, shooting photo and video reportage for expeditions, explorers, and professional athletes. Since 2018, he has worked as documentary director for RSI in Lugano, Switzerland.





Climbing Iran

53 min | Italy | 2020

“People often ask me why I wear nail polish. When I climb, it’s all scratched off. I look at my hands and think: Oooh - I did a lot of climbing today!” Nasim, with her hot pink nail polish is a pioneer of outdoor climbing in Iran, where women are meant to train in their veils on indoor walls only, during fixed hours, and only with other women. After being a young champion in different sports from karate to kickboxing, Nasim followed the call of the mountains. She decided to go beyond the barriers imposed on women in Iran. “Gravity doesn’t ask me what my passport is. It takes you down in the same way, whether you are rich or poor, black or white, Iranian or Italian.” The film profiles an extraordinary woman determined to push the barriers opposing her passion, whether they are physical, social, psychological, geographical, or ideological. Committed to changing things little by little, Nasim brings other young women to the walls of Polekhab outside Tehran, teaching them how to climb and get independent.

Filmmaker

Francesca Borghetti has a background in Cultural Anthropology, and worked in documentary since 2000. She received her Eurodoc diploma in 2010. Borghetti has developed, written, and produced a number of documentaries with DocLab, Fabulafilm, Rai Storia, Rai 5, and Babel Tv and been spokesperson for Doc/it, the Italian Documentary Association. She also worked for the TV program PETROLIO-RAI, responsible for acquiring national and international documentaries. *Climbing Iran* is Borghetti’s first feature documentary as director.

Israeli artist Dani Karavan has created nearly 100 environmental installations all across the world. He has won some of the most prestigious international art awards and regularly lectures about his groundbreaking work. Yet Karavan is far from satisfied. His monumental structures are rapidly deteriorating. Age is starting to catch up with him. 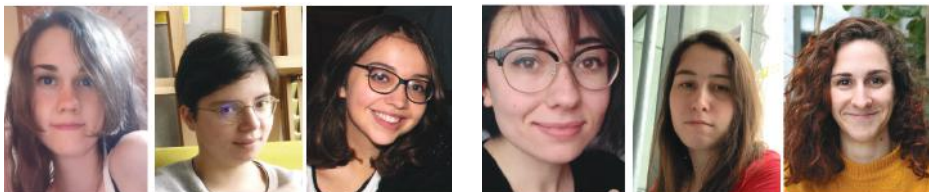

Ek Tha Gaon (Once Upon A Village)

“In our village, we have a saying: the dead come back to visit the living. Now those of us who remain have only these ghosts for company.” Semla is a ghost village in the Himalayan foothills. Climate change and dwindling prospects have driven the 50 families that once lived here to migrate to cities. With this migration, farming livelihoods connected to the terrain and seasons have faded away. Like her village, Leela is old, resilient, and forgotten. Despite loneliness and struggles with an aging body, Leela does not want to leave. Golu is the only young person in the village. Desperate to escape but without the means to do so, Golu roams around the abandoned village. The emotional journey of the two women changes their relationship with the place they call home. A way of life struggles to stay relevant.

Filmmaker

Srishti Lakhera's first feature documentary, *Ek Tha Gaon*, won the Audience Choice Award at the Seoul Eco Film Festival, 2021, was an official selection as India Gold in The Mumbai Academy of Moving Image (MAMI), and chosen for the Vision du Reel-Media Library. She co-directed *Ishq Dosti & All That*, a film produced for the Public Service Broadcasting Trust. In her decade-long career as a filmmaker and a media trainer, she has produced films for international organizations like UNISDR, government bodies such as the Forest Department of Uttarakhand, as well as national and international television including Doordarshan and Channel News Asia. Lakhera is associated with grassroots organizations across India and conducts filmmaking workshops for marginalized communities.





Everest – Najtazsia Cesta (The Hard Way)

54 min | Slovakia | 2020

When Chris Bonington and his team set out in 1975 to climb the south-west face of Mount Everest, the steepest and highest face in the world, they were attempting the ultimate mountaineering challenge that many previous expeditions had tried unsuccessfully. In August, 1975 the 18-member British expedition assisted by Sherpas and supplementary oxygen, reached the top. Bonington called the route leading through the face the “Hard Way.” In his bestselling book of the same name, he wrote that although Alpine style climbing — without supplementary oxygen, fixed ropes, and the assistance of Sherpas — is increasingly popular in the Himalayas, it was impossible to scale the south-west face in this manner. This has become a challenge for a younger generation of mountaineers, including a group of climbers from Slovakia. The film explores ways to find out what humans can do.

Filmmaker

Pavol Barabáš (1959) makes large-scale mountain-oriented and adventure films about how people survive in extreme conditions, in inaccessible wilderness, on wild rivers and glacial peaks, and in deep caves. His films show how we should treat the earth, with love and respect for nature, mental strength, and a moral conscience. Barabáš has been part of ground-breaking expeditions, including the co-discovery of a mega-cave on the Chimantá plateau and the first transit of the Ellsworth Mountains in Antarctica, and made much loved films about the Slovak mountains. Barabáš has won over 300 national and international prizes.

However, when the first rain falls, Reyboy will leave for the city to study. In *Last Days at Sea*, first-time director Venice Atienza joins Reyboy for his last summer at home. They spend the days watching the clouds change shape, and the nights looking up at the stars imagining life on Saturn. Reyboy shares the beauty he sees in the little things around him; the rocks, the crabs, the water. They talk about what it means to be home. Nothing seems to happen at the surface. But slowly, the cracks in Reyboy's paradise start to appear. While the fishermen of Karihatag risk their lives as the yearly storms become increasingly dangerous due to climate change, Reyboy's goodbye to the only life he has ever known becomes imminent.

Venice Atienza (1989) is a Filipino documentarian who observes how life transformations are carried out through everyday mundane actions. To create a space for author-driven documentaries, she co-founded Svemirko Film with Taiwanese filmmaker, Fan Wu. 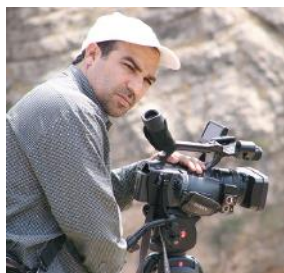

A Sherpa family breaks a taboo by taking part in an expedition to the Himalayan peak of Kumbhakarna, one of the holiest of mountains, to earn money for their son's schooling so he does not have to take on dangerous and poorly respected work as a porter. The east face of the 7,710m mountain is one of the most difficult challenges in alpinism today. The holy mountain confronts the leading alpinists seeking to summit it and the Sherpas with equal ruthlessness. The story of an extreme Himalayan expedition is told entirely from the Sherpas' point of view, like never before.

Filmmaker

Eliza Kubarska is a graduate of the Academy of Fine Arts and Wajda Film School in Warsaw and director of internationally awarded documentaries. Her debut, *What happened on Pam Island* (63 min, 2010), filmed in Greenland, won the Mario Bello Award at the Trento Film Festival. *Walking Under Water* (76 min, 2014, ARTE/ ZDF), shot on the seas and underwater around Borneo, explored the dying sea-nomad culture and won the Jury Prize at Hot Docs in Canada. *K2 Touch the Sky* (73 min, 2015, HBO), at the foot of the K2 mountain, asked what the price of passion is. *The Wall of Shadows* (May 2020) premiered at Hot Docs in Canada, as one of the nine titles chosen for the main competition out of over 3,000 entries. It won the Grand Prix at the Bergen International Film Festival and Best Film in Climbing at the Banff Mountain Film Festival. Eliza also won the Zürcher Filmpreis for best expeditions, including to Greenland, the High Atlas in Morocco, Mali in West Africa, or the tropical jungles of Malaysia. Eliza specializes in extreme location work and since 2008 has headed Vertical Vision Film Studio.





Taming the Garden

92 min | Switzerland/ Georgia/ Germany | 2021

A powerful and anonymous man has developed an unusual hobby. He buys centuries-old trees, some as tall as 15-storey buildings, from communities along the Georgian coast and has them excavated for installation in his private garden. In order to transplant trees of such dimensions, the landscape surrounding them is ripped apart and the people living around them are forced to adapt to the disruption. As the film follows this process, it portrays the needs and values of today's Georgian society and reflects on the theme of forced migration, where "uprooting" is more than a metaphor.

Filmmaker

Salomé Jashi was born in Tbilisi, Georgia in 1981. She studied journalism and worked as a reporter for several years before being awarded a British Council scholarship to study documentary filmmaking at Royal Holloway, University of London in 2005. Salomé's *The Dazzling Light of Sunset* (2016) was awarded the Main Prize at Visions du Réel's Regard Neuf Competition as well as at ZagrebDox, Jihlava IDFF, Valdivia IDFF, and several other festivals. An earlier work, *Bakhmaro* (2011), co-produced with ma.ja.de. filmproduktion and MDR/Arte, received an Honorary Mention for Young Documentary Talent at DOK Leipzig, won Best Central and Eastern European Documentary at Jihlava IDFF, and was nominated for the Asia Pacific Screen Awards and Silver Eye Awards. Salomé is the founder of two production companies: Sakdoc Film and Microcosmos, both producing documentaries and fiction of high artistic quality. She was a fellow of Nipkow Scholarship in 2017 and DAAD Artists-in-Berlin Program in 2020.

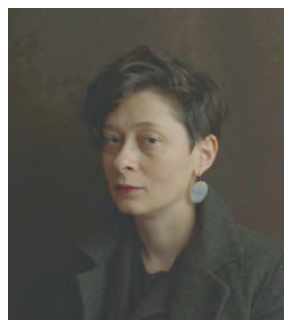

The Icefall Doctor

53 min 21 sec | Nepal | 2021

The Icefall Doctor is based on the life of Everest legend Angnima Sherpa, a significant presence on the mountain, but obscure in the vast world of Everest history and film, even for Everest enthusiasts. Angnima worked on Everest since 1975, on what is statistically the most dangerous profession on earth: managing the Khumbu Icefall on Everest by fixing and maintaining the ropes and ladders that Western mountaineers use to have an opportunity to summit. He himself was the first official Icefall Doctor, a term bestowed on him by the legendary guide Rob Hall. The film is a kaleidoscopic and meditative view on Angnima's last season as leader of the Doctors before his death. His story reveals culture, commitment to family, chasms of class and financial inequity, and the burden of environmental stewardship.

Filmmaker

Sean Burch is a professional filmmaker, explorer, and conservationist who holds eight world records spanning six countries and five continents. He has over 130 first ascents of previously unclimbed mountain peaks, of which 117 were accomplished solo. Burch won National Geographic Channel's Ultimate Survival Alaska TV show and is the author of the acclaimed self-help book and program, *Hyperfitness®: 12 Weeks to Conquering Your Inner Everest* (Penguin Random House). He has spent over 20 years as a filmmaker. Burch's documentary and photography work have appeared on the BBC, AP, National Geographic, Reuters, CNN, CNNi, USA Today, ABC, NBC, CBS, FOX world news, and Outside.





The Journey of Ultimate Challenge: Huozhou Rapid Descent

20 min | China | 2020

We invited eight top extreme athletes from all over the world to come to China, to compete in eight incredible challenges in different locations. This film is the first documentary in the Extreme Sports Challenge Series in Asia. The world's top motocross drivers went to Turpan, the hottest place in the world, to open up a new free riding route. The world's top driver, Max, spent five days on this challenge, encountering many difficulties and challenges, unsure whether he could complete his task. We bring a documentary eye to extreme sports challenges, seeking the whole story and narrative. A production team of 28 people completed the film with just five days of recording time.

Filmmakers

Liu Jiang, the founder of Ox Studio Extreme Sports is an acclaimed extreme sports film director and photographer, who has produced or shot over 200 extreme sports films and more than 10 documentaries. He has produced a large-scale Arctic adventure documentary and a documentary film, *Magellan on Land* in cooperation with National Geographic and worked extensively with Red Bull. Extreme sports are developing slowly in China. The filmmaker seeks to bring out the human element, exploring different stories to find new ways to move his audience.

At this time, over two million Nepalis worked in the Gulf States and Malaysia, including a large percentage of the country's young men between the ages of 18 and 40. Their earnings sustained every third household. Twelve years later, in retreading the trajectory of these four men, we are afforded a chronicle of their ordinary and yet remarkable journeys, a glimpse into their motivations, gains, and losses over more than a decade.

Kesang Tseten's films have screened regularly at KIMFF and other international film festivals for over two decades. Romain Assie-Rio is a filmmaker specialized in extreme sports and adventure filmography. In 2018, he spent three months in the Alaskan wilderness and made a film about the expedition. From 2021 to 2022, he will be on a sailing expedition from Europe to Antarctica.

The only way to save everyone, they say, is to kill the animal. Sasan wants to avenge his mother and protect the whole village. But he realizes that forgiveness is better than taking revenge. The animals attack their prey out of hunger and instinct. Yet they are wise and emotional creatures, and humans should forgive them.

Filmmaker

Marjan Khosravi is a young Iranian filmmaker who studied Cinema and Media Arts. After nine years spent writing, studying, and working in cinema and film production including as assistant director, she directed her first short documentary, *The Price of Blood*, in 2018, garnering admiration at many national festivals. *The Snow Calls*, her first mid-length documentary, was selected for the student competition at IDFA 2020 and won the best feature documentary award at Big Sky Documentary Film Festival. It was selected for the competition section of many festivals like DMZ, IFEF, and Ethnofest. *Vadiyar*, her second short fiction film, has been nominated for the Grand Prix of 40th edition of the Uppsala short film festival. Women and their social problems are the leitmotiv of Khosravi's films.





Village Des Femmes (Village of Women)

83 min | Armenia/ France | 2019

A village where women, children, and elderly people reside. The men are away for nine months, working in Russia. Summer has a slow, friendly atmosphere: women do the hay, cut the grass, and can fruit and put away stores for the winter. The sun arouses a laziness, a sensual relaxation. Autumn, with its shades of red, is the season of birth and of the potato harvest. Women and men find intimacy in the coldness of winter, and so women give birth in October and November. Fathers meet their children in December. Preparations start to welcome the men, but a form of suspense and a long, tiring wait set in: whose husband will come first? The men arrive with the snow. The women are shy, they need time to be in the presence of men. But the children are happy to be close to their fathers. Spring arrives, tense. Men depart for the land of the tsars. The women, weak and sad, need to find strength to take care of the children.

Filmmaker

Tamara Stepanyan was born in Yerevan, Armenia. During the breakdown of the Soviet Union in the early 90s, she moved to Lebanon. After studying and working in Lebanon, she studied at The National Film School of Denmark. For the last seven years, the award winning filmmaker has been working and living in France, finishing two feature documentary films, and preparing for her next fiction feature. Stepanyan's films have been shown at festivals like Locarno, Busan IFF, Amiens IFF, Talinn Black Nights Film Festival, and La Rochelle. She regularly teaches "education a l'image" at various schools.

Bally Peak Outlook 2020 Expedition

3 min 11 sec | Nepal | 2020

Last fall, in conjunction with the Bally Peak Outlook Foundation, an expedition team embarked on the first phase of the “8x8000m” program to clean up the base camps of Nepal’s eight 8,000m mountains. The 47-day cleanup during the months of lockdown was led by environmental activist and mountaineer Dawa Steven Sherpa. It removed 2.2 tons of waste from the base camps of Cho Oyu (8,188m), Everest (8,848.86m), Lhotse (8,516m), and Makalu (8,485m). The Covid-19 crisis has had significant effects on Nepal, where the tourism industry supports over a million jobs. The program helped support communities of the Everest region, which were deeply impacted by the lack of tourists. Four short films document the effort, each dedicated to one 8,000m peak and focusing on a specific theme related to sustainability and local culture.

Filmmaker

Samir Jung Thapa is an award-winning filmmaker and photographer with over 10 years of experience in documentary filmmaking and the founder of Klikman Productions. His career started with walking the length of the country along the Great Himalaya Trail and later producing a documentary about snow leopard collaring in the Kanchenjunga region. Thapa’s documentary *Ghosts of the Mountain* was screened at numerous film festivals including KIMFF and WCFF in Washington DC. In 2019, Thapa summited Everest while working on the issue of pollution in the mountains. His film *Bally’s Everest Cleanup Campaign*, made with Bally Switzerland, won multiple awards at the Miami and Croatia film festivals.

In the backdrop of the civil war of Nepal, two teen rebels work to bury and dispose of bodies of those who have died in the war. They collect things markers of communist ideology found on the bodies, inspired by senior comrades. This desire leads to complications, betrayal, and dictatorship.

**Filmmaker**

Umesh Ghorsaini is a lawyer by profession who turned to acting in independent Nepali short films. After some years of acting, in 2014 he began to work as a scriptwriter for a Nepali feature entitled *Duffers*. In 2016, he was art director for the feature film *Lama La*. He is writing a feature film about injustice, drawing on his earlier professional expertise and experiences. A recent short experimental movie, *Mirage* was shortlisted at KIMFF 2019.

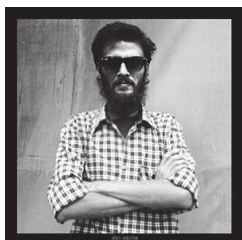

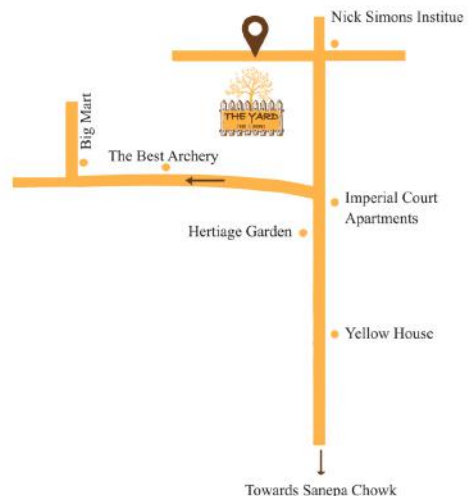

Lahureni (Gurkha Girl)

35 min | Nepal | 2021

Dilmaya, a young girl from the mountains of Nepal, wants to lift her family out of poverty. She hears news that Britain, which has traditionally recruited young Nepali men in its army for more than 200 years, will recruit Nepali young women in its Gurkha regiments. Dilmaya sees it as a once in a lifetime career opportunity, a chance to earn a lucrative salary in comparison to the average Nepali income. She travels to a nearby city, a day's bus ride away from her village and joins a training center to prepare for the rigorous selection process. The training is tough and the girls work as hard as the boys. Dilmaya and a dozen other hopeful young girls devote themselves to training. At the same time, governments of Nepal and Britain negotiate for several years but do not reach an agreement about the recruitment of Nepali girls into the British Army. Dilmaya, who will soon cross the age limit for recruitment, fears that she might be ineligible to join Nepal's national forces as well.

**Filmmaker**

Bishal Magar is a trainer in a pre-Gurkha training center. In 2016 he had the opportunity to learn the fundamentals of cinema through a short filmmaking course in Kathmandu. The following year, he earned a diploma from Dov Simons's Cinema Director and Film Production program. Magar has written and directed a few short films, and *Lahureni* is his first documentary short.

Cycling keeps him mentally and physically fit, reduces his carbon footprint; it offers him a better view. The film encourages people to start small and from where you stand. Blue Moon Turning Into Grey (Winner)

On June 15, 2021, the Marshyangdi floods displaced Taal village, one of the finest tourist spots in Manang district, washing away homes. Nikita, a grade 10 student now has to walk three hours from her home to the makeshift classrooms in tents. The broken computers, ruined classrooms, buried books and lost boots are symbols of their hopes being washed away by climate change induced floods. They don't know why this is happening. An older villager shares his experience about the Taal in his childhood and the Taal his children know. Fifty-nine households yet hundreds of painful stories. However, the villagers haven't lost hope. They are rebuilding their lives.

Climate Change Changing Children

A little acknowledged fact is that children too are in the frontlines of climate change. The film tells the story from the perspective of children and how the gradual scarcity of water is having an effect on their lives. We captured on film the lives of two young girls, Kushala and Kamala, as they try to balance their lives between the need to constantly gather water, and the need for their own space and time for educational, social, mental, and childhood pursuits.

Climate Change in Himalayas

The documentary explores the impact of climate change in a remote Himalayan community. It documents the testimonies and experiences of community members and the environmental changes they have witnessed. Local villagers speak about how irregular rain and snowfall have resulted in an alarming scarcity of drinking water and impacted natural resources like yarsa gumba. The youth are concerned that the authorities are not addressing the serious issue of climate change.

Green Growth - Green Recovery

This short film focuses on the need to protect the environment and biodiversity. We are living in an age of urbanization and industrialization. Cleaning up the damage to our environment and preventing further destruction may seem like a monumental task. But it is possible to do so by changing our daily habits and working with others to spread awareness about the importance of Green Growth - Green Recovery, by managing waste, both biodegradable and non-biodegradable, by making compost from waste materials, and by following the 3Rs, i.e. Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

“I am Hanumante” personifies Hanumante River and portrays the river’s struggles, how it has witnessed many changes. The film tries to make people aware about why climate change is not one problem but is an amalgamation of many combined problems.

Regenerative Agriculture: An approach to combat climate

dir: Dikshyant Poudel

The film focuses on the aspect of zero carbon economy and ways to minimize carbon emission by dumping it inside land through regenerative farming. Research has proved that the earth’s soil contains about 2,500 gigatons of carbon which is more than three times the amount of carbon in the atmosphere and four times the amount stored in all living plants and animals. The most natural solution for this problem is the practice of regenerative farming at household level. The film features a 42-year-old women from Kathmandu who has been practicing regenerative farming as a way of improving land productivity and the environment.

Santhal

We have tried to show the impact of climate change on the indigenous Santhal tribe living in the southern plains of Nepal. The Santhal are mainly dependent on agriculture but untimely rains and changing weather patterns have affected their livelihood. The film looks at how climate change means uncertain futures for the younger generation.

Everest - By Those Who Were There – 1921, 1922, 1924

Produced in the centenary year of the first Everest expedition, 'Everest by Those Who Were There – 1921, 1922, 1924 follows Julie Summers, the great niece of Sandy Irvine, as she explores the history of the three earliest Everest expeditions. Using the original footage shot by John Noel in 1922 and 1924, photos, artefacts and written records, as well as the expertise of prominent Everest mountaineers, Julie guides us from the first thoughts of climbing Everest in the 1890s, all the way up to the tragic disappearance of Mallory and Irvine in 1924. The film is an opportunity, not just to celebrate the scientific, geographical, technological and mountaineering accomplishments of these early expeditions, but also to look again at the world's highest peak. To reassess our relationship with it after more than a century of climbing, and to follow the threads of how it came to be a social, cultural and political nexus that still fascinates climbers and the wider public today.

John Porter has lived a truly international life. Born in Springfield Massachusetts to an English father and American/Canadian mother, his education and working life have been spent on both between America and Britain while traveling and climbing extensively around the world. He has worked in many jobs - engineering consultant, shop floor worker, park ranger, magazine editor, outward bound instructor, mountain guide and is an award winning writer and now a film producer. His book *One Day as a Tiger* won several international awards including the Grand Prize at the Banff Mountain Book Festival in 2014.

Filmed by women in Kanchanpur, supported by Sara Parker, Sara Baumann, Sushma Bhatta and Laxmi Dhital from 'Dignity Without Danger'. The team used the collaborative film making approach based on participatory methods to train a group of 13 women



in Kanchanpur to create, analyze, and film their everyday experiences of menstruating between January 2020 and March 2021. The footage was edited into a short documentary '8 days' giving the audience an intimate insight into the lived realities of women during their period. It provides a detailed look into the lives of women's practices and traditions during each day of their menstrual cycle.

The women also wrote, performed and filmed a short drama to help explore the impacts of menstrual beliefs and taboos at the local level called 'Stay Away' and wrote, performed and sang 5 songs related to menstruation. 'Stay Away' tells the story of a loved village grandmother who believes she has been cursed and fallen ill from being touched by a menstruating woman. In the story, the grandmother must navigate social pressure from family and neighbors, decide between using traditional and western medicine, and wrestle with the evolving belief system that is shifting over generations. The drama ends with a powerful message for those still following harmful menstrual practices from Nepali women themselves.
